COORDINATOR'S ROLE

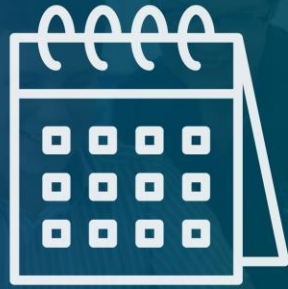
1. Works with Academic Deans, House Deans, Careers/Vet Coordinator and AP Curriculum to achieve positive outcomes for all students

Australian Tertiary Admission Rank



1.

The ATAR is the standard measure of overall school achievement used in all other Australian States and Territories.

2.

It is a rank indicating a student's position overall relative to other students.

3.

The ATAR is expressed on a 2000-point scale from 99.95 (highest) down to 0, in increments of 0.05.

4.

ATARs below 30 will be reported as '30.00 or less'.

Australian Tertiary Admission Rank



5.

To be ATAR-eligible, students must receive a “C” in General English/General Literature/Essential English.

6.

English will only count towards ATAR if it is one of the student’s best five subject results.

NOTE: *General English/General Literature are prerequisites for many University courses.*

ATAR CALCULATION

ATARs calculated from best 5 subject results, one of which may be:

- A VET Certificate III or above
- An Applied Subject

HOW WILL VET BE INCLUDED IN THE ATAR?



Each VET qualification level will have a **single** scaled score that can be included in the student's ATAR.

A scaled score for a Cert IV will be higher than a Cert III

Completed VET courses will still be used for tertiary education in two ways:

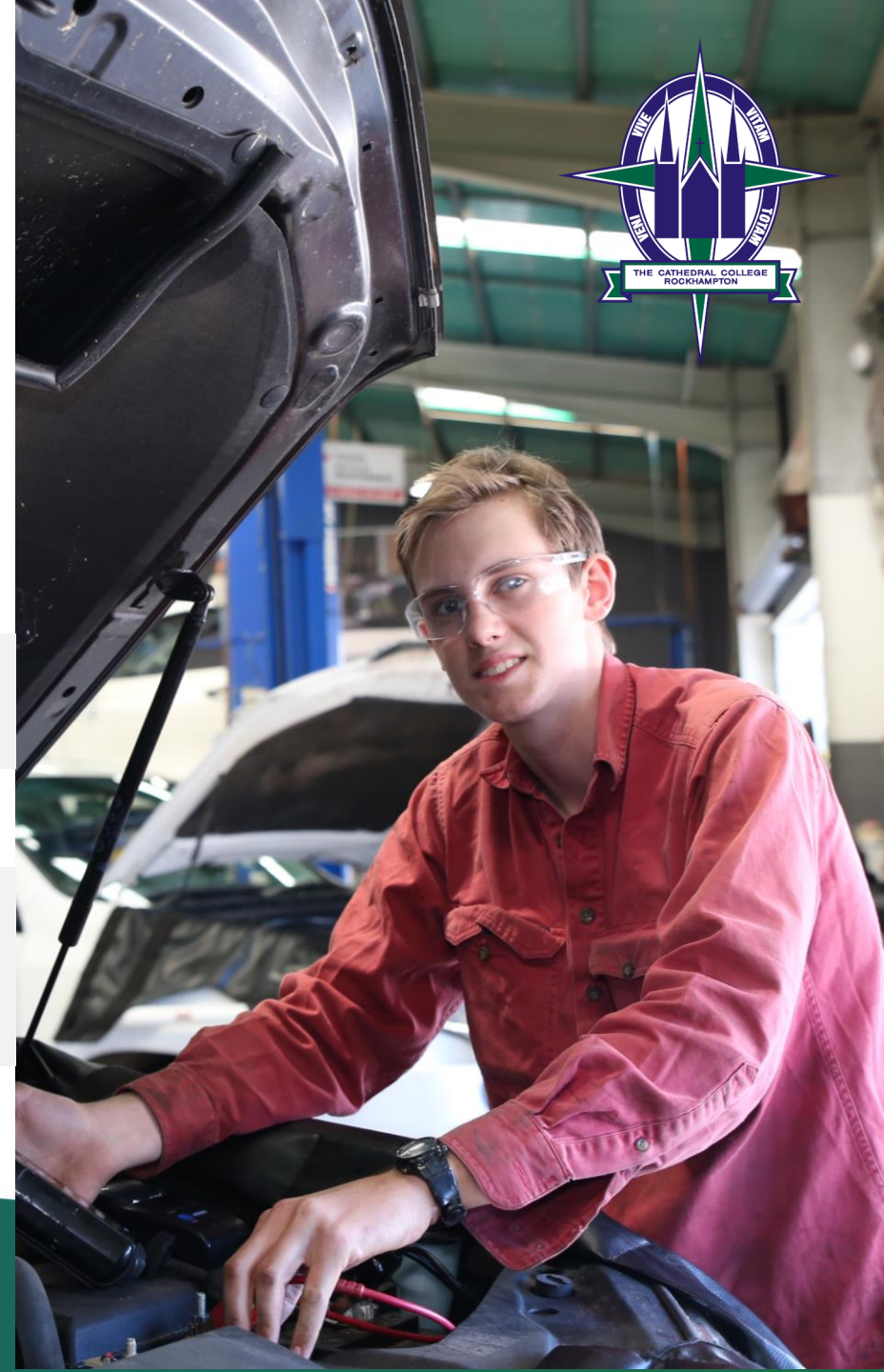
